This report covers the first two months of the fiscal year beginning on July 1. As it is the second month of the quarter, estimates of revenue have been included for invoices billed only once quarterly.

GRRCD's **accounts receivable** is \$379,014 plus a **retention receivable** (grant funds withheld pending closure) of \$34,750 for a total of \$413,764 receivable from grant activity, a decrease from July of \$12,667.

The unexpended portion of our advances to date totals \$114,618 and appears as deferred revenue (a liability) on the balance sheet. This represents all advance payments from various sources less expenditures to date.

Our county bank balance is in the positive at \$379,014. The positive balance reflects receipt of our promissory note of \$500,000 on April 30th. On September 16th, we paid off the Note Payable in the amount of \$500,000 plus interest for a total of \$505,760. Our payroll account at Exchange Bank has a positive balance of \$41,986, an advance funds account at the same bank is holding \$473 as well as a small donations account of \$120. Gold Ridge's prepaid expense of \$16,923 represents prepayments for liability, workers compensation and truck insurance for the 2020-2021 fiscal year. Prepaids for the 2019-2020 fiscal year have been fully written off.

The **accounts payable** balance is \$185,064 compared to \$116,423 in the prior month, an increase of \$68,421. Other items include a credit card payable of \$2,044, net pension liability (GASB 68), deferred revenue as noted above and reflecting last fiscal year's GASB update, paid time off liability (compensated absences) as well as funds owing Cal Pers retirement, payroll taxes and our voluntary 457 retirement plan if unpaid at month's end.

Our **equity** this month is at a positive \$159,048 compared to \$147,000 at the end of July, an increase of \$12,048. (Note: Some minor changes to the July report were made after the board meeting resulting in a change to \$147,000 from \$145,151 in equity).

The Statement of Operations for August reports \$256,631 in revenue and \$251,698 in expenses (including principal payments on the truck and COVID-19 expenses) for a net gain of \$4,933 year to date).

We await our upcoming audit and GASB 68 report this fall.

Definitions:

- Statement of Net Assets (the balance sheet) lists all our assets, both cash and noncash:
- Assets include our cash in bank, funds expected from our grant activity but not yet received ("accounts receivable" and "retention receivable"), prepaid expenses, and the value of our physical assets.



- *Liabilities* are made up of money we owe to vendors, cash advances from grantors, credit card and payroll liabilities.
- *Equity* is the difference between our assets and liabilities or net worth as an organization.
- *Net Income* is the difference between assets and liabilities in this Fiscal Year
- Statement of Operations shows income and expenses for the current period.

 DATE: October 15, 2020

<u>Summary</u>

Approval of Executive Director to enter contract with Trout Unlimited (TU) for \$111,575 for streamflow monitoring associated with implementation of the Alliance Redwoods Water Conservation Project (#165). This contract will cover all TU monitoring tasks and will run through 2024. Costs will be covered by a grant for the project secured from the California Wildlife Conservation Board (WCB) through the North Coast Resource Conservation and Development Council (NCRC&DC), which covers most of the cost of project implementation.

Background

Over the past several years, GRRCD has worked with the Alliance Redwoods Conference Grounds (ARCG) to develop a water conservation project that will allow the cessation of surface water diversion by ARCG in a tributary of Dutch Bill Creek, and reduce by 90% the amount of water diverted from a series of sidehill wells adjacent to the ARCG property.

The project will change ARCG's water sources and implement a suite of water conservation measures to reduce overall irrigation water demand. ARCG's potable water, now sourced from sidehill wells on a neighboring property, will be switched to the Camp Meeker Rec and Park District's (CMRPD) well in Monte Rio. This water will be conveyed to ARCG and treated using CMRPD's existing infrastructure, which will be upgraded as part of the project. This component of the project requires a change in ARCG's existing appropriative water rights, moving the points of diversion from surface water in Redwood Gulch (a major tributary of Dutch Bill Creek) to the Monte Rio well. Non-potable water demand will be reduced by 50% by shrinking the irrigated athletic field area, amending and aerating the soil, replacing the existing grass with drought-tolerant turf and replacing the existing irrigation system with a more efficient system. The source of non-potable water will change from Redwood Gulch to the neighboring sidehill wells. Overall demand for water sourced from Dutch Bill Creek and its tributaries on ARCG and neighboring properties will be reduced from approximately 2.8 million gallons per year to 300,000 gallons.

In September of 2019, GRRCD (with the North Coast Resource Conservation and Development Council as a fiscal sponsor) submitted an implementation funding proposal for \$1.5 million to

the Wildlife Conservation Board's Streamflow Enhancement Program. This grant was awarded in the spring of 2020 and will cover approximately 80% of the cost of implementation. An additional implementation funding proposal to cover the balance of the project cost was submitted to the California Department of Fish and Wildlife's (CDFW) Fisheries Restoration Grants Program in the spring of 2020, and we expect a funding decision by the end of the year. The WCB grant requires three years of streamflow monitoring in Dutch Bill Creek to both document baseline conditions and measure the impacts of project implementation.

Discussion

GRRCD has worked with TU through the Russian River Coho Partnership for over a decade, and for the past five years TU has performed all streamflow monitoring related to Coho Partnership efforts in both Green Valley and Dutch Bill Creeks. This contract will cover all TU costs to continue to monitor streamflow at established stream gauges in Dutch Bill Creek, as well as install and maintain a new gauge in the ARCG reach of Dutch Bill, performing streamflow measurements, downloading and managing stage data, and analyzing collected data. Streamflow monitoring will commence in 2021 and continue for three years, per the requirements of the WCB grant.

Fiscal Information

TU's estimated cost for all streamflow monitoring tasks related to implementation of the Alliance project is \$111,575, which is covered through the WCB grant.

Staff Recommendation

Approve the Executive Director to enter contract with TU for Alliance implementation preparation for \$111,575.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

between

Gold Ridge Resource Conservation District

and

Trout Unlimited

Streamflow Monitoring Alliance Redwoods Water Conservation Project

RECITALS

This Agreement is between the Gold Ridge Resource Conservation District (GRRCD) and Trout Unlimited (TU) for activities requested of TU by GRRCD to conduct streamflow monitoring in the Dutch Bill Creek watershed. These services are requested as part of GRRCD's agreement with the North Coast Resource Conservation and Development Council (NCRC&DC) to administer the Alliance Redwoods Water Conservation Project (PROJECT) under Wildlife Conservation Board (WCB) Grant Agreement WC2001-AP.

TU is to be considered an independent contractor, and all persons employed by TU in connection with works covered by this Agreement are not to be considered employees of GRRCD in any respect whatsoever.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Effective Date. The effective date of this agreement is November 1, 2020. Work under this agreement shall continue until either party terminates the Agreement; provided, however, with respect to services initiated under the Agreement, the terms and conditions herein shall continue through the completion of such services.
- 2. Termination Date. The termination date of this agreement shall be December 31, 2023.
- **3.** Contractor Designation and Reporting Requirements. GRRCD is considered a subcontractor of NCRC&DC, the recipient of the WCB grant. TU shall be considered a vendor for purposes of the PROJECT. GRRCD shall be responsible for reporting all information in accordance with NCRC&DC and WCB requirements.
- **4. Termination.** Either party shall have the right to terminate this contract for any reason upon 15-day written notice to the other party. In the event of such termination, TU will be entitled to payment for all work performed under this agreement prior to termination.
- **5. Scope of Work.** A Scope of Work and Budget for this Agreement have been prepared by TU (Exhibit A), and are attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein. TU represents itself to be experienced and competent to perform such services. These services are in connection with GRRCD's engagement by WCB to administer the above-referenced PROJECT, and are to be rendered in partial discharge of those engagements.

6. Payment and Fees

- A. Work will be compensated on a time and materials basis in accordance with the attached Scope of Work and Cost Estimate (Exhibit A). GRRCD and TU agree that if additional services are needed, a mutually agreeable change order to this contract shall be prepared.
- B. All invoices and statements rendered to GRRCD by TU shall indicate the number of hours worked, dates worked, and such additional information as GRRCD shall reasonably request. The total compensation shall in no event exceed One Hundred Eleven Thousand, Five Hundred and Seventy-Five Dollars (\$111,575.00) without express written approval of GRRCD. The compensation provided for in this article shall be the total consideration to TU, and shall include all of TU's expenses incurred in rendering requested services.
- C. An original invoice with all required documentation shall be submitted no more frequently than monthly to: Gold Ridge Resource Conservation District, 2776 Sullivan Road, Sebastopol, CA 95472, Attn: John Green.
- D. GRRCD staff shall review each TU invoice and submit it for approval of payment by the GRRCD Board of Directors. Compensation shall be paid to TU after the next regularly scheduled meeting of the GRRCD Board (on the third Thursday of the month) following receipt of payment from NCRC&DC. The GRRCD Board shall review the invoice at their regularly scheduled meeting. No bill can be paid without Board approval.
- **7. Performance of Services.** TU agrees to render its services as stated in Exhibit A. TU shall give immediate notice to GRRCD where any event occurs or condition arises which the TU considers to constitute a basis for any modification of this Agreement. GRRCD and TU shall mutually agree on cost and completion date adjustments suitable for any such modification.
- 8. Delays. Neither GRRCD nor TU shall be liable for default or delay under this Agreement caused by acts of God, or other events beyond the control of such party. Such acts or events shall include storms, floods, fires, epidemics, war, riot, strikes, lockouts, or other labor disputes, and acts of the government, its agencies or officers, federal, state, or local.
- **9.** Suspension of Services. GRRCD may suspend performance of services hereunder at any time by written note to TU. Any suspension shall extend the Agreement completion date commensurately. GRRCD shall pay TU necessary and reasonable costs incurred by TU directly attributable to the suspension in addition to other compensation provided for by this Agreement.
- **10. Proprietary and Confidential Information.** There is a possibility that as part of executing the work described in Exhibit(s) TU will need to obtain and use information considered confidential or proprietary by GRRCD, its subcontractors, or the landowner(s). I n this instance, GRRCD will inform TU that GRRCD considers such information confidential or proprietary. TU agrees that, during and after the term of this Agreement, it will not directly

or indirectly disclose to any third person, nor use for its own benefit or the benefit of anyone other than GRRCD, such confidential or proprietary information without obtaining prior authorization from GRRCD.

- **11. Ownership of Materials and Documentation.** It is understood that all materials resulting from the efforts of TU in connection with this Agreement, including documents, reports, calculations, maps, photographs, computer programs, computer printouts, notes, and any other pertinent data are to be the property of GRRCD. They shall be retained by TU for a minimum of three (3) years, and shall not thereafter be disposed of without prior written notice to GRRCD. Reuse of these materials by TU on projects other than the Alliance Redwoods Water Conservation Project is prohibited without written permission from GRRCD. Notwithstanding anything in this provision, GRRCD and TU are obligated to abide by 37 CFR Part 401 (*Rights to Inventions Made by Non-Profit Organizations and Small Business Firms Under Government Grants, Contracts, and Cooperative Agreements*).
- **12.** Accounting, Auditing, and Evaluation. TU shall prepare and maintain accounting records in support of all amounts billed to GRRCD. TU's files and records directly relating to performance of this Agreement and billing therefore shall be subject to audit by GRRCD or WCB at all times during the course of the project and for a period of three (3) years after project completion. TU further agrees to provide timely responses to all reasonable requests for information from GRRCD or WCB for purposes of evaluating the accomplishments of the Project for a period of five (5) years after the date on which the final reports for the project are provided.
- **13. Subcontracting.** The services under this Agreement shall be rendered by TU, and shall not be subcontracted to be performed by any other party without the prior written consent of GRRCD.
- 14. Liability and Indemnity. As an independent contractor, TU shall be responsible for its own operations, personnel and activities and assumes all liability for its negligent acts or willful misconduct in the course of work to be performed and for breach of any of the terms of this agreement. GRRCD and TU mutually agree, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to defend, indemnify, and hold each other, NCRC&DC, WCB, and the landowner harmless from any and all damage, liability, or cost, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of defense, arising from their own negligent acts, willful misconduct, errors, or omissions in the performance of their services under this agreement.

TU assumes all liability for workers' compensation and employer's liability coverage for its own employees.

15. Compliance with Applicable Laws. TU shall comply with any safety rules and procedures provided by GRRCD when working on the project, and with all applicable provisions of federal, state and local equal employment opportunity laws, rules, regulations and orders described in this agreement and with all other applicable laws, rules, regulations and orders.

16. Insurance Requirements. TU agrees to procure and maintain insurance of the kinds and amounts detailed in Exhibit B from insurance companies authorized to do business in the state of California, covering all operations under this Agreement. TU shall furnish to GRRCD a certificate(s) signed by an authorized representative of the insurance company(ies) showing that TU has satisfactorily complied with the insurance provisions herein within 5 days of the effective date of this agreement.

TU shall maintain at its own expense and provide evidence of sufficient commercial general and automobile liability, workers' compensation insurance as required by law or regulation for performance of services under this Agreement.

17. Governing Law and Venue. The parties agree that this Agreement, including its performance, validity, and interpretation, shall in all respects be governed by the laws of the State of California. The State of California, County of Sonoma, shall be the jurisdiction and venue for any dispute arising out or in connection with this Agreement.

18. Dispute Resolution.

- A. Intent. The parties intend to resolve all disputes and other matters in question arising out of or relating to the interpretation, application, performance or breach of any term, covenant or condition of this Contract through reasonable business-like negotiations without resort to litigation. If a dispute should arise regarding the obligations of GRRCD or TU, the parties shall attempt to resolve the dispute in accordance with this Dispute Resolution section. Unless the GRRCD requires otherwise, and regardless of the size or nature of the dispute, TU shall not cease or delay performance of its obligations under the Agreement during the existence of any dispute, and GRRCD shall pay to TU all amounts owing that are not subject to dispute or offset.
- B. Resolution Procedure. GRRCD and TU shall attempt to resolve any disputes in accordance with the following procedures:
 - i. Special Meeting. Either GRRCD or TU may call a special meeting for the resolution of disputes. The meeting shall be held within three (3) working days after delivery of written request for such meeting specifying the nature of the dispute to be resolved. If a meeting is called prior to commencement of the construction, the meeting shall be held at the GRRCD's offices; thereafter, the meeting shall be held at the project site. The meeting shall be attended by representatives of GRRCD and TU. Such representatives shall have authority to resolve the dispute and shall not be an attorney(s) actively practicing law.
 - ii. Mandatory Mediation. If the dispute has not been resolved within five (5) working days after the special meeting, both parties shall engage in a mediation proceeding, which shall be attended by all parties to the dispute and which, unless all parties to such proposed mediation proceeding agree otherwise, shall be conducted by an independent mediator, such as Judicial Arbitration and Mediation Service ("JAMS") in San Francisco, California, in accordance with its procedures. The costs of mediation shall be shared equally by all parties to such mediation.

- iii. Settlement. If, as a result of the mediation, a voluntary settlement is reached and the parties agree that such settlement shall be reduced to writing, the agreement may be enforced as a settlement agreement in the Sonoma County Superior Court. Such agreement shall be and have the same force and effect as an arbitration award in California and judgment may be entered upon it in accordance with applicable law in any court having jurisdiction thereof.
- iv. Evidence Code. All proceedings under this Dispute Resolution section shall be subject to California Evidence Code Section 1119. The restrictions set forth therein on the use of evidence from the special meeting or mediation shall apply to any arbitration as well as any court proceeding. The parties expressly agree to abide by subdivisions (a) and (b) of Section 1119, which provide as follows:
 - (a) No evidence of anything said or any admission made for the purpose of, in the course of, or pursuant to, a mediation or a mediation consultation is admissible or subject to discovery, and disclosure of the evidence shall not be compelled, in any arbitration, administrative adjudication, civil action, or other noncriminal proceeding in which, pursuant to law, testimony can be compelled to be given.
 - (b) No writing, as defined in California Evidence Code Section 250, that is prepared for the purpose of, in the course of, or pursuant to, a mediation or a mediation consultation, is admissible or subject to discovery, and disclosure of the writing shall not be compelled, in any arbitration, administrative adjudication, civil action, or other noncriminal proceeding in which, pursuant to law, testimony can be compelled to be given.
- C. The Contractor shall incorporate this Dispute Resolution into contracts with all subcontractors.
- D. This Dispute Resolution procedure shall not in any way affect any statutes of limitation relating to any claim, dispute or other matter or question arising out of or relating to this Contract or the breach thereof. This dispute resolution procedure may be conducted before or during the pendency of any other legal proceedings between GRRCD and any third party.
- **19. Attorney's Fees.** In the event either party brings an action or proceedings for damages arising out of the other's performance under this contract or to establish the right or remedy of either party, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorney fees and costs as part of such action or proceeding. This contract shall be construed and interpreted according to the substantive law of California, regardless of the law of conflicts to the contrary in any jurisdiction. Any action to enforce the terms of this agreement or breach thereof shall be brought and tried in the forum nearest GRRCD's office, in the County of Sonoma.
- **20. Lobbying and Certification and Disclosure.** TU agrees, to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, that:
 - A. No federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid by, or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or

employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.

- B. If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, or a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form LLL (Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying), in accordance with its instructions.
- **21. Signatures.** Unless otherwise specified below, the following signatories are the authorized representatives upon whose decisions and information each party may rely in performance of this Agreement. Any information or notices required or permitted hereunder shall be deemed to have been sufficiently given to either party if given to these signatories or to such other parties and/or address as they may subsequently designate.

EXHIBIT A

SCOPE OF WORK

Alliance Redwoods Water Conservation Project Trout Unlimited Scope of Work

<u>Stage and water temperature gaging:</u> Trout Unlimited will install one gage in a representative pool near the proposed project site in Dutch Bill Creek and will continue to operate the three existing streamflow gages in the network. Stage and water temperature data will be downloaded monthly during field site visits onto Trout Unlimited's field tablets. Upon return to the office, field crews will upload the raw datasets on to Trout Unlimited's streamflow database. These raw data will then be reviewed and calibrated. Trout Unlimited will manage, maintain and repair the gage network as needed during the project period.

<u>Streamflow monitoring</u>: For three summers, beginning in 2021, Trout Unlimited will collect monthly streamflow measurements through the dry season (May through October). Streamflow measurements will be uploaded to Trout Unlimited's database and inspected for quality assurance. Streamflow measurements will be used to develop rating curves of flow as a function of stage. Streamflow datasets will be developed and stored in Trout Unlimited's database.

<u>Final report summarizing streamflow conditions</u>: Trout Unlimited will produce a brief final report at the end of the project period summarizing the results of the streamflow and groundwater monitoring conducted for this grant. Streamflow datasets will be available in excel format upon request and will be uploaded to California Environmental Data Exchange Network (CEDEN) at the end of the project period.

EXHIBIT B GOLD RIDGE RCD INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS CONSULTING & GENERAL SERVICES

Trout Unlimited (TU) shall, at its expense, maintain or cause to be maintained the insurance coverages set forth with insurance companies acceptable to the Gold Ridge Resource Conservation District (GRRCD). Prior to commencement of services hereunder, TU shall deliver to GRRCD certificate(s) (a) evidencing the issuance of insurance containing the coverages required herein and (b) providing that the insurance shall not be cancelled or materially changed without thirty (30) days' prior written notice to GRRCD.

Commencement or performance of services without delivering the certificate(s) of insurance shall not constitute a waiver of TU's obligation to provide the required coverages. Also, in the event coverages required herein are faulty in any respect, such shall not constitute a waiver of TU's obligations to obtain the proper insurance. The policy (or policies) of insurance obtained by TU, except Workers' Compensation, shall provide that GRRCD, the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, their respective officers, directors, employees, and agents are additional insured for all coverages, to the extent of the indemnity provided by TU under this Contract.

- 1. Workers' Compensation and Occupational Disease Insurance. Workers' Compensation and Occupational Disease Insurance or the equivalent thereof, in an amount necessary to comply with the laws of the countries and/or states of origin of TU's expatriate employees and the country wherein the services are to be performed, with Employer's Liability coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000 each accident.
- 2. **Comprehensive General Liability Insurance.** Comprehensive General Liability Insurance including coverage for Contractual liability for this Contract, and Crossliability, in the amount of \$1,000,000 combined single limit each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. If GRRCD's General Liability Insurance is written on a "claims-made" form, it must provide for (i) a retroactive date prior to, or coincident with, the commencement of Service under this contract and (ii) a minimum extended claims reporting period of one (1) year.
- 3. Automobile and Commercial General Liability Insurance. If automobiles are to be furnished by TU in performance of services under this Contract, Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance, covering all vehicles owned, non-owned, or hired, in the amount of \$1,000,000 combined single limit each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage.

General Conditions for Insurance

- 1. TU hereby waives its rights of subrogation against the additional insureds to the extent of contractual liabilities assumed under this contract and shall cause its insurers to waive their rights of subrogation against the additional insureds.
- 2. With respect to insurance coverages maintain hereunder by TU and insurance coverages separately obtained by the additional insureds, all insurance coverages afforded by policies of insurance maintained by TU shall be primary insurance as such coverages apply to the additional insureds to the extent of contractual liabilities

assumed under this contract, and such insurance coverages separately maintained by the additional insureds, shall be excess insurance.

- 3. Where use of subcontractors has been approved by GRRCD, TU shall require all such subcontractors to obtain, maintain, and keep in force during the time in which they are engaged in performing Work hereunder, adequate insurance coverage and furnish GRRCD acceptable evidence of such insurance upon request. Any deficiencies in such coverage shall be the sole responsibility of TU.
- 4. No form of TU liability self-insurance, including, but not limited to, insuring with a parent, subsidiary, or affiliate organization, is acceptable or allowable under the terms of this contract unless agreed to by GRRCD prior to commencement of the Work.
