GRRCD's approach to evaluating potential solutions to chronic flooding at Green Valley Road

- The Gold Ridge RCD is dedicated to promoting voluntary conservation and enhancement of natural resources on residential and agricultural land in western Sonoma County
- Led by scientifically-based information: Green Valley Watershed Management Plan, Sediment Source Assessment for Upper Green Valley and Summary of Analysis of Flooding at Green Valley Road and Mitigation Alternatives
- Guided by collaborative Technical Work Group
- Each potential alternative needs to balance hydrology/geomorphology, fish and wildlife, landowner needs and public safety, and be technically and financially feasible

- O'Connor Environmental, Inc.: completed the feasibility studies, composed the conceptual design of the preferred alternative
- Regulatory agencies (including CDFW, USFWS, NMFS, USACE, NCRWQCB, County PRMD): ensure that the project adheres to all applicable laws and regulations
- California State Coastal Conservancy: one of the funders of the feasibility study
